Overview

Officially opening July 2, 1971, the Plaza Hotel & Casino was originally named “Union Plaza” paying homage to the Union Pacific Railroad Depot where it was built and where the first Las Vegas settlers arrived in 1905. Amtrak passenger train service continued until 1997 with the station and ticket windows connected to the hotel, giving the Plaza the distinction of being the only U.S. train station located in a casino.

At its opening, the Plaza was the largest downtown property at 22-stories, 504 rooms and a 66,000 sq. ft. casino. In the 1980’s, the second tower and convention center were added, making the Plaza the first downtown hotel to cater to the meetings and events market. The site of the current glass dome once held a one-of-a-kind swimming pool, overlooking Main and Fremont Streets. It was later transformed into the domed Center Stage restaurant, where a popular scene in *Casino* was filmed. The iconic glass dome is now home to the renowned and award-winning Oscar’s Steakhouse.



Original owners included veteran gaming executive, Sam Boyd; attorney/casino investor, J. Kell Houssels; downtown property owner, Jackie Gaughn; and developer Frank Scott. In 2004, Tamares Group took over sole ownership. Under Tamares’ ownership and the leadership of CEO Jonathan Jossel, the Plaza continues to reinvest in the property, upgrade its guest experience, and launch innovative offerings, like Las Vegas’ first all-inclusive hotel package.

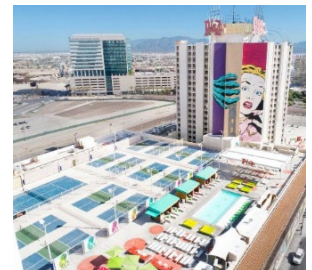


First, a \$35 million renovation updated all guest rooms, the reception area, and casino floor. Then, a \$15 million renovation created 100-plus Luxe guest rooms and suites on the top floors of the North Tower, offering premium accommodations with high end décor and energy efficiency and technology upgrades.

The Plaza also enhanced its iconic Main Street façade and porte-cochère into a one-of-a-kind destination for cocktails, gaming, and dining with four venues: Carousel Bar, Pinkbox Doughnuts, the rooftop patio at Oscar’s steakhouse, and downtown’s only smokefree and social media friendly gaming space.



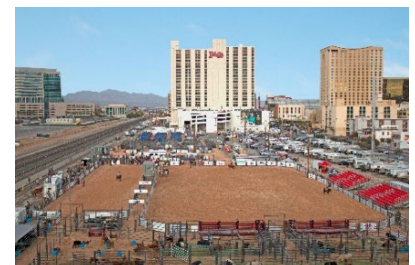
The Pool at the Plaza offers a “retro Palm Springs meets classic downtown Las Vegas” inspired outdoor space with a wet deck, hot tub, private cabanas, bar and food truck. Upgraded hotel suites with direct balcony access to the pool offer a unique amenity for guests. With 15 rooftop Pickleball courts adjacent to the pool as well as four ground floor courts, the Plaza has the most courts of any Vegas hotel/casino for this fast-growing sport. The rooftop pool deck is also where guests can watch the Plaza’s free Welcome to the Weekend Friday Fireworks every summer since 2023.



The Plaza boasts three unforgettable 21-story murals by internationally known artists, Shepard Fairey, D*Face and Faile on its North Tower. The murals add a vibrant artistic flare to the Plaza without compromising its historic integrity.

Other upgrades include: A multimillion-dollar renovation to its convention center, including downtown’s largest ballroom with upgraded A/V while making the space more flexible for multiple uses; a refurbished bingo hall, the only one in downtown, with 200 new electronic bingo units; and the Plaza Gym, a 5,000 sq. ft. facility that offers guests a modern, urban-style gym that is a hybrid between a boutique CrossFit gym and typical hotel fitness center.

Located adjacent to the Plaza, the CORE Arena is downtown’s first and only equestrian center with 80 equine stalls for year-round use bringing rodeo back to downtown Las Vegas. In addition, the CORE Arena is a multipurpose venue that can host everything from monster truck shows and demolition derbies to various sporting events – further diversifying the downtown experience and attracting more business and people to the area all year long.

Dining

From casual dining and quick bites to the classic setting of Oscar’s, one of the city’s best steakhouses, there is a dining option for everyone at the Plaza.

Oscar’s steakhouse

Bearing the name of former Las Vegas Mayor and defense attorney Oscar Goodman, Oscar’s is a classic Vegas steakhouse inside the iconic glass dome overlooking Fremont Street. It features perfectly aged steaks, made-from-scratch side dishes, and a wide variety of handcrafted cocktails, including Oscar’s favorite martinis.



Carousel Bar

An outdoor bar experience unlike any other, Carousel Bar serves handmade cocktails, beer, wine, and mocktails among life-sized Vegas-themed elements, including carousel horses moving up and down, a 14-foot-tall neon showgirl, and a rotating ribbon of lights above the bar, all under the iconic glittering lights of the Plaza’s porte-cochère overlooking the excitement of Main and Fremont Streets. It also was a primary location in U2’s 2023 music video for “Atomic City.”



Hash House A Go Go

Self-described as “*Twisted Farm Food*,” this down-home, comfort food comes in portions that would satisfy any ranch hand. It also boasts a creative menu and unique presentations. One of four locations in Southern Nevada, and the restaurant’s first in downtown Las Vegas.



Pop Up Pizza

The first gourmet pizzeria in downtown Las Vegas, Pop Up offers handmade pizzas using the highest quality ingredients including California tomatoes, pepperoni from the famous Ezzo Sausage Company of Cleveland, Ohio, and mozzarella from Brooklyn, New York. Pop Up Pizza offers fresh salads as well as vegetarian and vegan options too. Bar list includes draft beers and wine.



Coffee Bar

Coffee Bar offers its own Plaza Blend from the locally-owned Dark Moon Coffee Roasters to brew a delicious cup of coffee and a full selection of espresso and specialty drinks. Located in the Hotel lobby, guests can quickly pick up coffee or tea and a delicious pastry to get the day started – and then come back for an afternoon pick-me-up with a wide selection of Italian gelatos and lite bites.



Pinkbox Doughnuts

Through a giant 12-foot-tall 3D doughnut with sprinkles entrance, the award-winning Vegas-based Pinkbox Doughnuts sells more than 70 varieties of its delicious and whimsically designed doughnuts.



Food Court

Conveniently located next to the Plaza’s hotel lobby, the Food Court offers several options for a quick snack or beverage, including Fresh Mexican Grill that use only the freshest, finest quality ingredients available to create delicious, flavorful menu items for an authentic dining experience. The food court also features Subway.

Casino

The Plaza's 80,000 sq. ft. casino floor offers players' favorite slot machines, including penny slots, high-limit machines, classic favorites, the latest modern 3D slots, as well as multiple table games with the most lucrative odds in town, including 100% paybacks.

Table Games – The Plaza offers a variety of table games on its expansive casino floor. It has the city's most liberal blackjack tables that pay 3/2 and free bet blackjack as well as downtown's only single zero roulette, crapsless craps, and 10X odds on regular craps. The Plaza's casino also has three state-of-the-art roulette tables with LED gaming surface technology.



Slot Machines – Continuing to add games, the Plaza boasts more than 700 slot machines, including player favorites and some of the industry's newest games, such as downtown Las Vegas' first Wheel of Fortune 4D game. The Plaza also has the best video poker pay tables downtown with over 100 percent payback.

Smoke Free / Social Media Friendly Slot Area - Located by the dome entrance on Main Street, it is the first 100% smoke free gaming area in downtown Las Vegas, setting a new standard for clean-air entertainment. The state-of-the-art gaming space combines dozens of modern slot machines and three live table games with vibrant social media backdrops and copyright free music so guests can create unforgettable social media posts, stories and videos. The Plaza partnered with Vegas Live Casino Network to launch the only live streaming channel dedicated to broadcasting casino play in Las Vegas.

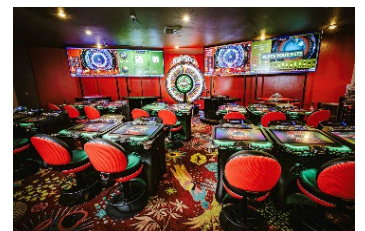
Bingo – The Plaza has the only bingo room in downtown Las Vegas and the highest payouts in Las Vegas. The renovated bingo room offers six daily sessions at 11 a.m., 1 p.m., 3 p.m., 5 p.m., 7 p.m. and 9 p.m. The Plaza also hosts 12 Super Bingo tournaments throughout the year that attract nearly 1,000 attendees from around the country.



Sports Book - The fully renovated William Hill Sports Book at the Plaza features an inviting lounge feel for guests to watch their favorite teams on an expansive seamless HD video wall, measuring 5 feet tall by 16.5 feet wide. The sports book also offers guests and bettors access to William Hill's mobile app, kiosks, and InPlay wagering menu just steps away from the Plaza's race & sports bar.



Electronic Table Games – Eighteen electronic table games, including roulette, craps, and multi- and single- hand blackjack, are in a dedicated space next to the Omaha Bar.



Plaza Rewards Players Club - Distinctly different from any other Downtown casino loyalty program, Plaza Rewards players advance quicker and earn rewards faster. New members receive up to \$50 free slot play. Points can be redeemed for bingo or casino play as well as at three downtown partner restaurants.

Keno - Games run every 5-8 minutes from 11 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily. The Plaza offers MegaKeno and Mega 10 Keno giving players access to statewide progressives with higher jackpots and possible payouts in the millions. Keno monitors with live games are located throughout the casino floor, including at the Omaha Lounge, Hash House A Go Go, and inside the Bingo room on the third floor. Members of the Plaza's Rewards Players Club can earn points for Keno play.

Hotel

The Plaza has **nearly 1,000 comfortable guest rooms and suites** that offer a stylish retreat with a nod to the Plaza's past through stunning black and white photography in every room. Hotel **suites with direct patio access to the rooftop pool** were also renovated and offer a unique amenity for guests.



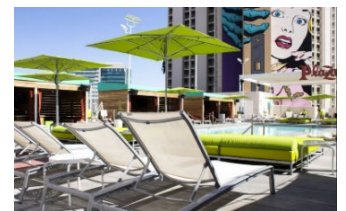
The top floors of the North Tower are home to more than 100 premium **Luxe rooms and suites** that feature redesigned floor plans, contemporary décor, high-end touches, and sought-after guest amenities, including a multitude of built-in USB charging ports, a 49-inch HD television with premium cable, coffee maker, and mini refrigerator.

Special Events

- The property has a team of professional event planners and expert caterers to assist with the planning of a convention, meeting or wedding in the Plaza's 30,000 sq. ft. **fully renovated event space**, including a 19,000 sq. ft. ballroom (the largest in downtown Las Vegas), a classic Las Vegas showroom, or at Oscar's steakhouse.
- The **convention center** has a fresh look with flexible spaces for multiple uses. It boasts a state-of-the-art BOSE sound system, energy efficient LED lighting, partition walls with improved sound absorption, and digital reader boards with smart phone connectivity to provide event information to attendees.
- **The CORE Arena** is downtown's first and only outdoor equestrian center with 80 equine stalls for year-round use. With two outdoor arenas for roping practice and exercise, the CORE Arena has brought rodeo back to downtown Las Vegas. It is also a multipurpose outdoor event venue with the capacity for nearly 3,000 people that can host everything from sporting events to demolition derbies.

Resort Amenities

- **The Pool at the Plaza** – a rooftop pool and recreation deck with resort style furnishings, hot tub, private cabanas, cocktail bar, food truck, and 15 dedicated Pickleball courts, the most of any hotel-casino in Las Vegas.
- **The Plaza Gym** offers traditional cardiovascular equipment alongside athletic sports style training options to create a unique hybrid between a boutique CrossFit gym and typical hotel fitness center.
- **Vintage Vegas showroom** with crushed red velvet seating classic glass chandeliers, original drapery, and cocktail service reminiscent of the entertainment heyday of the Rat Pack era.
- **In-Room amenities:** combination safe, 32-inch remote controlled TV with cable and pay-per-view movies, hair dryer, AM/FM clock radio, 2 bottles of water per day, in-room internet, iron/board.
- **Other amenities:** gourmet snacks from Las Vegas Jerkys, electric cars ordered on demand and delivered by the app-based car rental service Vay, and free self-parking for hotel guests, including Tesla charging stations.
